LD 49 An Act to Authorize the Deorganization of Drew Plantation

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 2 provides for the deorganization of Drew Plantation in Penobscot County, subject to approval by the voters at a local special election.

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 2 was enacted as an emergency measure effective April 10, 2023.

LD 87 An Act to Permit Emergency Funding For Food Banks When a State of Emergency is Declared

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 424 authorizes the Governor to distribute up to \$400,000 from the Maine Budget Stabilization Fund during a state of emergency to nonprofit entities, including food banks, food pantries and soup kitchens, that provide or distribute food to low-income, indigent or unemployed individuals or households without charge if the state of emergency lasts more than 10 days.

Public Law 2023, chapter 424 directs the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to adopt rules to prescribe the manner in which the emergency funding for nonprofit entities must be disbursed and authorizes the commissioner to leverage emergency funding for nonprofit entities to match any relevant federal funding available for qualifying food programs in the State.

Public Law 2023, chapter 424 prevents the Governor from suspending the adopted rules during a state of emergency.

LD 119 An Act to Clarify the Boundary Between Waldo and Knox Counties in Penobscot Bay

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 1 clarifies and describes a portion of the common boundary between Waldo County and Knox County located in Penobscot Bay to resolve a discrepancy between the legislative history of the boundary line and recent maps of the boundary line.

LD 133 An Act to Include a Representative of Newspaper and Other Press Interests on the Archives Advisory Board and to Require the Member Representing a Historical Society to Have Expertise in Archival Records

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 24 makes the following changes to the Archives Advisory Board, established in Title 5, section 12004-I and described in Title 5, section 96.

- 1. It adds a member to the board who represents newspaper and other press interests recommended by a statewide professional news organization.
- 2. It requires the member representing newspaper and other press interests have expertise in journalism.
- 3. It requires the member representing a state or local historical society have expertise in archival records.

LD 138 An Act Regarding the Terms of Trustees of the Phippsburg Cemetery District

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 4 reduces the term of the trustees of the Phippsburg Cemetery District from five years to three years beginning with the trustees elected to serve in 2024.

LD 153 An Act to Allow Electronic Distribution of Certain Documents to Municipalities and Electronic Acknowledgment of Receipt of Certain Documents as Acceptable Communications

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 87 makes the following changes in those sections of Title 30-A, chapter 3 that require a county provide a written estimate of proposed county taxes and a notice of the public hearing on proposed county taxes to all municipalities located in the county.

- 1. It requires a county to deliver the written estimate of proposed county taxes and notice of public hearing to each municipality within the county either by email or regular mail, or deliver the written estimate and notice in person.
- 2. It authorizes a municipality to request that a county send the written estimate and notice of public hearing to a municipality by email or regular mail.

3. If the written estimate and notice of public hearing are delivered by email or regular mail, it requires that the municipal clerk must confirm receipt of each.

LD 166 An Act to Provide Revenue for Property Tax Relief and Capital Infrastructure Projects

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 14 allows a municipality to use the revenue collected from parking meters within the municipality for property tax relief and to pay the costs of constructing, maintaining and operating capital infrastructure projects.

LD 205 An Act to Update the Reimbursement for Travel-related Expenses Incurred as a Result of the Performance of Legislative Duties

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 2 increases the travel-related expenses paid to members of the Legislature and members of the Penobscot Indian Nation, the Passamaquoddy Indian Tribe and the Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians elected to represent their tribes in the Legislature in the following ways.

- 1. It sets the mileage reimbursement rate at 55 cents per mile or the federal standard mileage rate, whichever is lower, for travel by the most reasonable direct route to and from a member's place of abode.
- 2. It sets the meal allowance at \$50 for each day in attendance at session.
- 3. It sets the housing allowance at \$70 for each day in attendance at session and for each day a member occupies overnight accommodations away from home either immediately before or after attendance at a daily session of the Legislature.
- 4. It sets the amount a member is entitled to receive as a daily meal allowance in lieu of the meal and housing allowance at \$50 per day.

Public Law 2023, chapter 2 was enacted as an emergency measure effective February 13, 2023.

LD 239 An Act to Establish the Pink-edged Sulphur as the State Butterfly

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 88 establishes the Pink-edged Sulphur (Colias interior) as the official state butterfly.

LD 269 An Act to Designate Granitic Pegmatite as the Maine State Rock

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 15 establishes granitic pegmatite as the official state rock.

LD 292 An Act to Establish Maine Needham Day

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 10 establishes the last Saturday in September as Maine Needham Day and requires the Governor to issue an annual proclamation recognizing the needham's place in the State's culture and culinary traditions.

LD 344 An Act to Establish Maine Alewife Day

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 11 designates the Saturday before Memorial Day as Maine Alewife Day and requires the Governor issue an annual proclamation encouraging observation of this day.

LD 354 An Act to Amend the Laws Regarding the Use of Licensed Professional Engineers on Certain Public Works Projects

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 174 repeals and replaces the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, section 1254. It exempts certain public works construction projects that otherwise require the services of a licensed professional engineer from the need for a professional engineer if: an authorized representative of a department of this State or any of this State's political subdivisions or any county, city, town, township or plantation engaged in the construction of the public works project issues a written determination that the life, health and property of the public will be adequately protected without the services of a licensed professional engineer; and the contemplated expenditure for the completed project does not exceed \$250,000. For purposes of issuing the written determination, the Director of the Bureau of General Services within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services is the authorized representative of a department of this State engaged in public works that constitute public improvements under Title 5, chapter 153. The law also clarifies that a department of this State or any of this State's political subdivisions or any county, city, town, township or plantation may still require the services of a licensed professional engineer for any public works project that meets both conditions.

LD 461 An Act Regarding Private Ways and Private Roads

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 387 makes the following changes to the duties of the Maine Abandoned and Discontinued Roads Commission, established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 23, section 3036.

- 1. It requires the commission to review the use of the following terms in the Maine Revised Statutes: "private way"; "public way"; "private road"; and "public easement".
- 2. It directs the commission to determine whether changes to current law would improve understanding and use of these terms throughout the Maine Revised Statutes.
- 3. It requires the commission to submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government by January 5, 2024 that includes the Commissions conclusions and recommendations.

Public Law 2023, chapter 387 gives the commission the authority to meet more than six times in 2023 to complete this work.

Public Law 2023, chapter 387 changes the definition of "repairs and maintenance" as it applies to road associations established and operating in accordance with Title 23, chapter 305 to include paving in locations where pavement does not exist if the paving is approved by an affirmative vote of at least 3/4 of the owners of all the parcels benefited by the private road, private way or bridge at a meeting called in accordance with Title 23, section 3101, subsection 2. It adds installing reclaimed asphalt or grinding existing asphalt pavement for reuse within the definition of "repairs and maintenance." It allows road associations to establish a reserve account to hold funds for repairs and maintenance, and it changes the expiration date of a notice of claim recorded with the registry of deeds from 18 months to six years.

LD 628 An Act to Designate Maine Irish Heritage Day

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 47 designates March 17th as Irish Heritage Day and requires the Governor to issue an annual proclamation encouraging observation of this day

LD 670 An Act to Protect Birds in the Construction, Renovation and Maintenance of Public Buildings

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 221 requires the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of General Services to develop, by December 31, 2024, guidance regarding the integration of bird collision risk management into public improvements.

The guidance must be available on the bureau's publicly accessible website and must be developed in consultation with expert stakeholders and must include an explanation of: architectural design threats and landscape design threats to birds; the cost differentials and the comparative effectiveness of materials, designs and other methods for reducing bird collisions; and other considerations for reducing bird collisions.

Public Law 2023, chapter 221 requires the guidance be considered in the construction of public improvements and renovations of public improvements in which more than 50% of a building facade is substantially altered. The guidance does not apply to public buildings, landscapes or districts listed on the National Register of Historic Places or determined to be eligible for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places, including the State House and the Blaine House.

Public Law 2023, chapter 221 requires the Bureau of General Services submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government no later than December 31, 2024 detailing the guidance developed. Beginning December 31, 2026, and biennially thereafter, the Bureau of General Services must submit a report detailing use of the guidance during the previous 2-year period.

The committee may submit legislation relating to the subject matter of each report received.

LD 735 An Act to Require the State to Hold a Public Hearing in a Municipality Before the State Constructs a Solar Project in That Municipality

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 177 requires the Department of Transportation, the Maine Turnpike Authority and any state agency installing a solar energy project that disturbs more than 1,000 square feet of land area to hold a public hearing in the municipality where the project is to be located.

LD 884 Resolve, to Study the Creation of a State Employee and Legislative Child Care Center

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 55 requires the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to complete a study of the creation of a state employee and legislative child care center. The study must be done within existing resources and a report must be submitted, by October 1, 2024, to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government.

LD 893 An Act to Amend the Legislative Membership of the Hancock County Budget Advisory Committee

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 148 provides that, by October 1, 2023, and by October 1st of every odd-numbered year thereafter, the Hancock County legislative delegation must select, by majority vote, a member of the delegation to serve on the Hancock County Budget Advisory Committee for a period of 2 years. If the selected member resigns from the Legislature or the budget advisory committee prior to the expiration of the 2-year term, the delegation may select another member to fulfill the remaining term of office. The delegation may also replace its selected member by a 2/3 vote of the delegation.

Public Law 2023, chapter 148 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 12, 2023.

LD 917 An Act to Validate Certain Proceedings Authorizing the Issuance of Bonds and Notes by the City of Rockland

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 10 validates the referendum conducted in the City of Rockland on November 8, 2022. It authorizes the City of Rockland to enter into contracts and issue bonds or notes of the city in an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000 to finance roads and sidewalk improvements, \$2,400,000 to finance the permanent closure of the city landfill and \$15,000,000 to finance storm water projects, plus up to 2% for costs of issuance.

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 10 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 16, 2023.

LD 1007 An Act to Ban the Video Hosting Service TikTok on All State-owned Devices

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 385 bans TikTok on computers or other electronic devices owned or controlled by any branch of State Government, unless access is necessary for life, health, safety or investigative purposes in accordance with agency policy.

Public Law 2023, chapter 385 was enacted as an emergency measure effective July 6, 2023.

LD 1029 Resolve, to Establish a Commission to Commemorate the 250th Anniversary of the Founding of the United States

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 126 establishes the 15-member Commission to Commemorate the 250th Anniversary of the Founding of the United States and the nonlapsing Maine Semiquincentennial Fund. Commission members serve until December 31, 2026 and may receive reimbursement for necessary expenses related to the performance of the member's duties on the commission. The fund terminates on December 31, 2027 with any unexpended balance in the fund being transferred to the General Fund.

The resolve requires the Secretary of State to administer the fund; chair the commission; appoint five members of the commission to constitute an executive committee; and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than December 1, 2023. The Secretary of State also has authority to employ staff to serve the commission; with advice from the commission, appoint honorary members to the commission; establish an advisory council composed of people who are especially interested in the celebration of the United States Semiquincentennial; and request additional appropriations from the Legislature for necessary expenses of the commission.

The commission is directed to develop and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States through educational and historical events, activities and programs throughout the State. The Commission must submit an annual report on its activities to the Governor and the Legislature. All state agencies and political subdivisions of the State are required to cooperate with the commission and may grant funds, property and services to the commission to carry out the purposes of this resolve. The Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House serve as ex officio members of the commission.

LD 1136 An Act to Clarify Term Limitations for Legislators, Constitutional Officers and the State Auditor

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 289 provides that for purposes of the Term Limitation Act of 1993, a consecutive term does not include a term that begins after the 3rd Wednesday in June in an odd-numbered year.

Public Law 2023, chapter 289 takes effect 90 days after adjournment of the First Special Session of the 131st Legislature and applies to Legislators and constitutional officers currently serving in office.

LD 1155 An Act to Address Legislative Salary

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 446 increases the salary of Legislators to \$25,000 in the first year of each biennium and to \$20,000 in the 2nd year of each biennium, beginning with the 132nd Legislature.

LD 1173 An Act Directing the Bureau of General Services to Ensure Adequate Air Quality in All State-owned and State-leased Buildings

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 392 makes the following changes to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1742-G.

- 1. It adds radon to the list of substances that may be harmful to human health that the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of General Services must test for in state-owned and state-leased building.
- 2. It requires the bureau to develop mitigation plans when harmful levels of radon are found in these buildings.
- 3. It requires the bureau to conduct radon tests in the State House and report the findings with mitigation recommendations to the Legislative Council of the Legislature by January 15, 2024.

LD 1243 Resolve, Directing the Secretary of State to Propose a State Calendar

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 91 requires the Secretary of State, or the Secretary's designee, to propose a calendar, to be known as the "state calendar", that includes important religious days and holidays of the State's residents and the citizens of the United States. The calendar shall be developed within existing resources and in consultations with persons representing religious traditions practiced in this state; the Permanent Commission on the Status of Racial, Indigenous and Tribal Populations; and the federally recognized Indian nations, tribes or bands in the State based on the joint recommendation of the tribal governments.

Resolve 2023, chapter 91 requires the Secretary of State to submit a proposed state calendar to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government by January 31, 2024. The committee may submit a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature adopting a state calendar.

LD 1260 Resolve, to Study Expansion of Civics Education and Engagement Through the Secretary of State

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 42 requires the Secretary of State to study the efficacy, feasibility and benefits of appointing a deputy secretary of state to coordinate civics engagement and education matters.

The law also requires the Secretary of State to study the efficacy, feasibility and benefits of moving staffing and administrative services for the Maine Commission for Community Service, established under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 7501, from the Department of Education to the office of the Secretary of State in consultation with the Commissioner of Education.

The report must be submitted to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government by December 6, 2023, including any recommendations and suggested legislation. The committee may report out a bill relating to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 131st Legislature based on the report.

LD 1336 An Act to Increase Transparency in Municipal Ballot Referenda Expenditures

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 314 makes the following changes related to municipal ballot referenda expenditures.

- 1. It requires a ballot question committee that spends more than \$5,000 to influence a municipal referendum campaign in a town or city with a population of less than 15,000 to register and file reports with the Commission of Governmental Ethics and Election Practices established under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 1, section 1002, using the Commission's electronic filing system.
- 2. It requires the Commission of Governmental Ethics and Election Practices to be responsible to oversee the filing of registrations or campaign finance reports related to municipal campaigns in towns or cities with a population under 15,000.
- 3. It applies the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 21-A, chapter 13, subchapter 4 to all municipal referenda campaign finance reporting.

LD 1350 An Act Regarding the Composition of the Budget Advisory Committee and the Finality of the Budget in the Franklin County Budget Process

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 262 makes the following changes to the Franklin County Budget Advisory Committee, established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 873, effective November 5, 2024.

- 1. It establishes that the term of office of Franklin County Budget Advisory Committee members elected from the three county commissioner districts expires on November 5, 2024, which is the date Franklin County is divided into five county commissioner districts.
- 2. Beginning on November 5, 2024, it authorizes the municipal caucus for each of the five county commissioner districts to elect two members to the budget advisory committee to serve a three-year term.
- 3. Beginning November 5, 2024, it requires that an additional member must be elected to the budget advisory committee to serve a one-year term. The member must be elected, on a rotating basis, from among the five districts.
- 4. It requires that the election of members to the budget advisory committee must occur before April 1st of each year an election is required.
- 5. It requires that the final adoption of the Franklin County budget necessitates a 3/5 vote of the entire membership of the budget advisory committee.

LD 1687 An Act to Improve Geographic Information System Data Acquisition and Maintenance

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 471 requires the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to review the Office of Information Technology, the Office of Geographic Information Systems and the Maine Library of Geographic Information to determine whether the current organizational structure of these three entities provides state agencies, the Legislature and the public with relevant, up-to-date information in the most efficient and cost-effective manner.

LD 1704 An Act Regarding Incarcerated Individuals and Legislative Apportionment

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 373 makes the following changes for purposes of apportionment pursuant to the Maine Constitution and the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 21-A, chapter 15.

- 1. It requires that a person who resides in a correction facility under the jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections, excluding county and municipal detention facilities and facilities used to house county prisoners, at the time of the Federal Decennial Census, must be counted by the Legislative Apportionment Commission as residing at the person's residential address immediately prior to incarceration, if such an address is contained in the records of the Department of Corrections.
- 2. It requires that the Department of Corrections provide to the Legislative Apportionment Commission, within 30 days of the first meeting of the commission, the preincarceration address and other demographic data of persons incarcerated in a correctional facility as of the date of the most recent Federal Decennial Census to the extent the Department possesses or has access to such data.

LD 1821 An Act to Validate Certain Proceedings Authorizing the Issuance of Bonds and Notes by the City of Bath

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 9 validates the referendum conducted in the City of Bath on November 8, 2022. It authorizes the City of Bath to enter into contracts and issue bonds or notes of the city in an amount not to exceed \$13,050,000 to finance the construction and equipping of a new fire station.

Private and Special Law 2023, chapter 9 was enacted as an emergency measure effective June 15, 2023.

LD 1934 Resolve, to Improve the Coordination and Delivery of Planning Grants and Technical Assistance to Communities in Maine

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Resolve 2023, chapter 51 requires the Office of Policy Innovation and the Future to review opportunities and structural changes in the organization of State Government that will result in the improved coordination and implementation of planning grants and technical assistance programs for Maine communities and regional planning and development organizations. The office must conduct the review in consultation with diverse stakeholders including municipal and regional planning entities.

The law requires the office to make recommendations in coordination with state agencies that manage programs and grant funds across the State supporting community planning and technical assistance and to make recommendations regarding budget and staffing matters in consultation with the Department of Administration and Financial Services. The office must submit a report with regard to the review and consultation that includes proposed legislation and financial and staffing implications of the recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government and the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs by December 6, 2023.

LD 1939 An Act to Amend the Membership of the Maine-Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission and the New England and Eastern Canada Legislative Commission

ENACTED LAW SUMMARY

Public Law 2023, chapter 415 makes the following changes to the membership of the Maine-Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission and the New England and Eastern Canada Legislative Commission.

- 1. It increases the membership of the Maine-Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission from eight members to 12 members.
- 2. It increases the membership of the New England and Eastern Canada Legislative Commission from four members from Maine to eight members from Maine.
- 3. It requires the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House to appoint legislative members to the Maine-Canadian Legislative Advisory Commission equally from the two parties holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature.

Public Law 2023, chapter 415 was enacted as an emergency effective July 19, 2023.

ANALYST NOTES

LD 86 An Act to Restore the Former State of Maine Flag

This bill was finally enacted in both the House and the Senate prior to the adjournment sine die of the First Special Session but was not signed by the Governor. Pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, the final disposition of this bill will be determined during the next legislative session.

LD 165 An Act to Increase the Governor's Salary

This bill was finally enacted in both the House and the Senate prior to the adjournment sine die of the First Special Session but was not signed by the Governor. Pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, the final disposition of this bill will be determined during the next legislative session.
