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## **COMMITTEE AMENDMENT**

1	SUMMARY
2	This amendment deletes language referencing the purposes of the new Elder Victims
3	Restitution Fund created in the bill to avoid inconsistencies in terms and purposes.
4	This amendment strikes out the section amending the provision of existing law that
5	prohibits killers from benefiting from their crimes against their victims. Instead, this
6	amendment adds a new section to the Probate Code that prohibits a person convicted of
7	any crime of which the decedent was a victim from benefiting to the extent the convicted
8	person owes restitution to the decedent.
9	This amendment removes the provision of the bill that authorizes the Elder Victims
10	Restitution Fund to accept private donations, federal funds and state funds designated by
11	law.
