The plan must provide for:

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SUMMARY

2 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve and is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety. It requires the Department of 3 Public Safety, Office of the State Fire Marshal to develop a detailed plan to privatize the 4 5 inspection of amusement rides in Maine and to report back to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice and public safety 6 7 matters by January 15, 2013, along with any draft legislation. It authorizes the committee to submit legislation to the First Regular Session of the 126th Legislature to privatize 8 amusement ride inspections and to alter the fee structure used by the Office of the State 9 10 Fire Marshal for amusement ride inspections. It also adds an appropriations and 11 allocations section.
