13 14	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
15 16 17 18	Whereas, prescribers and dispensers of scheduled drugs may be prohibited by health information privacy laws from informing law enforcement personnel about suspected drug diversion, which puts emergency health care workers at risk of violence; and
19 20 21	Whereas, emergency health care workers will remain at greater risk of violence unless the law governing disclosure of certain information to law enforcement personnel is clarified; and
22 23 24 25	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'
26 27	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:

1 2	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.'
3	SUMMARY
4	This amendment replaces the bill. It replaces the language from the bill with
5	language that mirrors the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of
6	1996 regulations in 45 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 164.512(f)(5). It also adds
7	an emergency preamble and emergency clause.
