Sec. 1. 16 MRSA §614, sub-§3, ¶D, as amended by PL 2009, c. 181, §2, is
further amended to read:

4 D. A victim or victim's agent or attorney. <u>The victim or the victim's agent or</u> 5 <u>attorney must be provided with intelligence and investigative information as</u> 6 <u>complete and as soon as possible</u>, subject to reasonable limitations to protect the 7 interest described in subsection 1; or

**SUMMARY** 

9 This bill requires the victim of a crime to be provided with investigative information 10 in as complete and rapid a manner as possible, as long as the disclosure of that 11 information is made with safeguards to prevent events such as interference with law 12 enforcement proceedings, an unwarranted invasion of privacy, disclosure of information 13 designated confidential and endangerment of the life of another individual.
