Senator **MILLS**: Men and women of the Senate, I have just learned this morning that Justice David Roberts, who was fundamentally from Bangor, though earlier than that from the County, has died. He had had a career on the bench that was probably as long as anybody that I know of.

He started out as a very young member of the Judiciary. When I was first starting out myself, I can remember carrying a bag for one of my senior partners and I had taken this briefcase home the night before and had been instructed to pick up frozen raspberries, which I put in the briefcase for some completely unexplainable reason. The next morning when I was carrying this bag to assist my law partner, I found myself bleeding raspberry juice in Justice Roberts' chambers, which he accepted with good grace as he did all things. He was a truly wonderful resolver of human disputes. He had a great sense of humor. My wife clerked for him in 1981, just out of law school. He was clearly one of the most well liked members of the Law Court and of the Superior Court before that and for a time I believe he was Assistant US Attorney. My memory is that we just approved moving him to Actively Retired status last August and I wish that he'd had somewhat longer to enjoy his retirement. I needed to say a few words about his death and I appreciate your allowing me to do so.
