ORDERED, the Senate concurring, that the Task Force to Implement the 1991 Report of the President's and Speaker's Blue Ribbon Commission on Children and Families is established as follows:

- 1. Task force established. The Task Force to Implement the 1991 Report of the President's and Speaker's Blue Ribbon Commission on Children and Families, referred to in this order as the "task force," is established.
- 2. Task force membership. The task force consists of 10 members as follows:
- A. The President of the Senate;
- B. The Speaker of the House;
- C. The Majority Leader of the Senate;
- D. The Assistant Majority Leader of the Senate;
- E. The Minority Leader of the Senate;
- F. The Assistant Minority Leader of the Senate;
- G. The Majority Leader of the House of Representatives;
- H. The Assistant Majority Leader of the House of Representatives;
- I. The Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; and
- J. The Assistant Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 3. Chairs. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives are the chairs of the task force.
- 4. Convening of task force. The chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force no later than 45 days after adjournment of the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature.

- 5. Duties. The task force shall create a plan to implement the recommendations of the 1991 Report of the President's and Speaker's Blue Ribbon Commission on Children and Families.
- 6. Staff assistance. Upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis shall provide necessary staffing services to the task force.
- 7. Compensation. The members of the task force are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses related to their attendance at meetings of the task force.
- 8. Report. The task force shall submit its report, together with any recommended implementing legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government no later than November 1, 2001. If the task force requires an extension of time to complete its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.
- 9. Task force budget. The chairs of the task force, with assistance from the task force staff, shall administer the task force's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the task force shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for its approval. The task force may not incur expenses that would result in the task force exceeding its approved budget.

Upon request from the task force, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council or the executive director's designee shall promptly provide the task force chairs and staff with a status report on the task force budget, expenditures incurred and paid and available funds.

The Department's ability to produce such an in-depth analysis is due to in large part to the Legislature's support for our increased automation and econometric modeling. Maine, I believe, is one of only two states able to analyze Tax Incidence at this level. While this is an imperfect science, we believe this to be an invaluable asset to the Legislative and Executive branches in making policy decisions.
