# JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO ALLOW IMPROVED MEDICARE SUPPLEMENT INSURANCE POLICIES OFFERING PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Twentieth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the Congress of the United States, as follows:

WHEREAS, prescription drugs provide essential treatment to all our citizens in this country; and

WHEREAS, retail expenditures on prescription drugs in most states have approximately doubled over the past 6 years; and

WHEREAS, citizens in the United States often pay the highest prices in the world for prescription drugs, and due to these excessive prescription drug prices, access to such prescription

drugs is often unobtainable to certain people confronting serious illnesses: and

WHEREAS, federal rules currently regulate uniform Medicare supplement insurance policies that are available for sale to people eligible for Medicare coverage; and

WHEREAS, coverage for prescription drugs through the federally regulated Medicare supplement insurance uniform A-J policies is very limited; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That, We, your Memorialists, request that the United States Congress make a change to federal rules and regulations to allow the development of Medicare supplement insurance policies offering greater prescription drug coverage than is currently available; and be it further

### JOINT RESOLUTION DESIGNATING MARCH AS IRISH HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS, over 150 years ago a massive blight struck Ireland's potato crop, which became known as the Great Hunger, forcing many Irish to immigrate, mostly to American shores; and

WHEREAS, these people came to America to seek a better life and escape the brutal poverty and starvation of their homeland, and by 1850 over a million people left Ireland; and

WHEREAS, in 1847 alone, 25,000 Irish immigrants arrived in Boston and many had started to arrive in Maine, so that the census figures of Maine indicated that Maine cities had 11 to 23% of their populations as Irish-born immigrants; and

WHEREAS, within a few years of their arrival in the United States and in Maine, these Irish immigrants took jobs as laborers, built railroads, canals and schools, and dedicated themselves to helping build this Nation and State, and this legacy remains a part of today's American landscape; and

WHEREAS, 4 signers of the Declaration of Independence were Irish-born and 9 signers were of Irish ancestry, and 19 Presidents of the United States proudly claim Irish heritage, included among them, George Washington, the father of our country; and

# JOINT RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE PERSIAN GULF WAR AND HONORING THE MAINE VETERANS WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE WAR

WHEREAS, on August 2, 1990, Iraqi military forces, on orders from President Saddam Hussein, invaded and occupied the small country of Kuwait, against the wishes and interests of the rest of the world; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations Security Council immediately passed several resolutions condemning the attack and closing Iraq from the international community and resolving to free Kuwait; and

WHEREAS, over 30 nations formed a military coalition to liberate Kuwait, including the United Kingdom, Canada, many North Atlantic Treaty Organization, NATO, countries and the United States; and

WHEREAS, military units and service members from Maine, representing the Maine Army and Air National Guard, Brunswick Naval Air Station, United States Marine Corps Reserves and United States Army Reserves were either activated or volunteered for service as part of the military coalition; and

WHEREAS, specific units stationed in Maine, the 101st Air Refueling Wing; the 3620th Transportation Detachment; the 286th Supply and Service Battalion; the 112th Medical Company, Air Ambulance; the Health Service Liaison Detachment of the 213th Medical Brigade; the 619th Transportation Company; the 1125th USAR Hospital; the 94th Military Police Company; the United States Marine Corps Reserve Weapons Company; the 101th Navy Hospital; the COMSC Navy Medical 201; and Patrol Squadron 8, were mobilized in support of Operation Desert Storm; and

WHEREAS, this brief but deadly war, which lasted from January 16, 1991 to February 28, 1991, was fought to stabilize the vital area of the Middle East and to liberate Kuwait, and cost the lives of thousands of soldiers and innocent people; and

WHEREAS, the ground war proved to be quick and decisive and American forces led a military coalition to a victory over the Iraqi forces, and each state provided a valuable contribution to the successful American presence; and

WHEREAS, the State of Maine, with its position of being the closest state to the Middle East, proved its value in spirit, personnel and patriotism towards the war effort; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twentieth Legislature, now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the Persian Gulf War and Operation Desert Storm and to honor Maine citizens who contributed so greatly to the service of their State and Nation; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the United States Secretary of Defense, the United States Secretary of State and the Commissioner of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management on behalf of the people of Maine as a token of their esteem and affection.
