Prayer by Reverend Karen Munson of Readfield United Methodist Church.

REVEREND MUNSON: I'm a little fuzzy this morning. I've just returned from the Gulf region with the mission team of 16 teenage students and 10 adults. I want to share with you a thought that we kept in mind during our week of looking at staggering problems and discovering small and vibrant possibilities. It comes from an African theologian named John Mugambwa. He wrote, 'Deep within energies that bear us lifework is a conviction that we are not closed systems nor frozen pillars of possibility like Lot's wife.' Our team members truly found that as we encountered the people in that region who are struggling to rebuild their lives. In the season that we Christians practice as Lent, these 26 people sacrificed something that you are also sacrificing by being here, one of the most precious modern resources, and that is time. Because we believed that our combined energy made available by this gift of time is part of the possibility for building communities and building lives, we discovered that the real hope there, and I think the real hope here, is the resiliency and the tenacity of the people who we serve. We discovered new hopes and sacrifices in ourselves. I watched a 17 year old young woman from China sacrifice her fear and learn to get up a roof and drive shingles. I watched Rick from the mill in Livermore Falls sacrifice his vacation and Tyrique, a dapper young man from New York, sacrifice his pride as his foot went through said roof. I watched Nona who sacrificed sleep to feed all of us. You, who serve the State of Maine, know that it's hope lies in the creativity and the tenacity and the willingness to sacrifice of its people. Every day that you spend together is a sort of mission trip. That's the thought I give you today. As you give your own sacrifice of time, remember that you join citizens that know it's possible to live together in ways that draw on all of our strengths and all of our possibilities. Shall we spend just a moment in prayer.

Gracious God, who makes life possible, help us to recognize the tremendous challenges before us and not to minimize the difficulty of them. Yet help us at the same time to draw upon the incredible resources that You give us, resources within ourselves and resources within our communities, knowing that each is a gift given to be sacrificed for the good of each other and of all. Bless this Body as they work their best today and give them moments of rest in that work that will sustain them. Amen.

WHEREAS, the Legislature has learned with deep regret of the death of:

Harold E. Jones, of Yarmouth, World War II veteran, ranger pilot, avid sportsman. Mr. Jones enlisted in the U.S. Navy on his 17th birthday and served during World War II at naval air bases in the Pacific. Much of his life was dedicated to public service. In addition to working for 29 years for Sunoco, Mr. Jones joined the Falmouth Fire Department in 1950 and served as Fire Chief from 1960 to 1973. He enlisted in the Coast Guard in 1957 as a petty officer and retired in 1985 as a lieutenant commander. Mr. Jones was an expert marksman who served as an instructor for the State Fire Marshal's Office. He was a ranger pilot with the Maine Forest Service for 30 years and during that time he fought hundreds of forest fires and participated in many successful searches and rescues. Mr. Jones received a number of awards including Falmouth's first Citizen of the Year award in 1967 and the FAA's Master Pilot award, for more than 50 years as a safe pilot. Mr. Jones will be greatly missed and long remembered by all whose lives he has touched;

The family members are here today. His son, Adam, is here and his daughter, Rebecca, is here. His granddaughter, Madeline, and his grandson, William, are also here.

Many of my associates will remember Jonesy as a storyteller. He was the best of the best. I've been around a long time and he was a storyteller. When I say he was the best of the best it's because his thoughts were right out of the St. John River Valley. He kept us in stitches for hours with tales of the North country. Jonesy was a real plus for the State of Maine. He was a dedicated State employee. As we're debating the issues here in the State capital on a hot dry windy afternoon in May we may hear a helicopter fly by. Who knows, it may be Jonesy off to a fire, working for the betterment of the State of Maine.
