In Senate Chamber Wednesday May 2, 2007

Senate called to order by President Beth Edmonds of Cumberland County.

Prayer by Reverend Glenn Metzler of Kennebec Mennonite Church in Augusta.

REVEREND METZLER: Thank you. President Edmonds, honorable Senators of the State of Maine, thank you for the invitation for me to share an invocation with you this afternoon as you begin your session. This afternoon I would like to pray for wisdom as you deal with all those issues surrounding the budget and I would also ask God for discerning hearts as you provide for the people of this great State of Maine and as you carry out your various duties from day to day. Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, I thank You for these few moments with these men and women who are committed to serve the people of our state as Senators. Lord, it is said if any of us lacks wisdom he or she should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given. Today I ask You for wisdom to be given generously to these men and women to carry out the duties of this day. Lord, give them insight into making wise decisions regarding the budget and the many other decisions and

deadlines they face from day to day in this role. Lord, I would also like to ask a blessing on the families of the Senators that are represented in this chamber. Keep them safe in their various communities across this state and provide for their needs. Guide each of us in the personal decisions we make and may we keep ourselves healthy so we can approach our work with clear minds and with the energy needed for this day. At the end of the day, may each of us have no regrets and know that we have done our best. I would ask these blessings for us in the name of our Lord. Amen.

The following Joint Resolution:

H.P. 1315

JOINT RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING MAY 2007 AS LYME DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH IN THE STATE OF MAINE

WHEREAS, the health and well-being of the citizens of the State of Maine are of paramount importance and Lyme disease is a common but frequently misunderstood illness that, if not caught early and treated properly, can cause serious health problems; and

WHEREAS, according to the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Lyme disease was identified and named in 1977, when arthritis was observed in a cluster of children in and around Lyme, Connecticut and the Council of State and Territorial Epidemiologists designated Lyme disease as a nationally notifiable disease in January 1991; and

WHEREAS, Lyme disease is the most common vector-borne disease in the United States and is caused by the spirochete Borrelia burgdorferi, which is usually transmitted by the bite of a tick. Children aged 5 to 9 and adults in their 50s and 60s comprise the age groups at the highest risk; and

WHEREAS, Lyme disease early on can cause rash and flulike symptoms such as fever, muscle aches, headaches and fatigue but can be treated with antibiotics if caught early. Unfortunately the disease often goes undetected because it mimics other illnesses or may be misdiagnosed; and

WHEREAS, if left untreated, Lyme disease can lead to severe heart, neurological, eye and joint problems because the bacteria can affect many different organs and organ systems; and

WHEREAS, during 2005, a total of 23,305 cases of Lyme disease were reported in the United States, a 15 percent increase over the previous year. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicates that the actual number of reported cases of Lyme disease that meet its criteria is 10 times the amount

reported, bringing the actual number of cases that meet the center's criteria to 233,050 for 2005; and

WHEREAS, Lyme disease accounts for 95 percent of all vector-borne infections in the United States and the ticks that spread Lyme disease also spread other diseases, such as ehrlichiosis, anaplasmosis and babesiosis, and the presence of other tick-borne diseases clouds the diagnostic and treatment picture; and

WHEREAS, having a Lyme Disease Awareness Month provides an opportunity to focus on this significant and complex disease; to provide information on and raise public awareness of its causes, effects and treatments; and to underscore important education and research efforts surrounding Lyme and tick-borne diseases; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-Third Legislature, now assembled in the First Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, recognize that May of 2007 is Lyme Disease Awareness Month in order to make our citizens more aware of this prevalent disease; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a suitable copy of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Department of Health and Human Services.

'Whereas, having a Lyme Disease Awareness Month provides an opportunity to focus on this significant and complex disease; to provide information on and raise public awareness of its causes, effects and treatments; and to underscore important education and research efforts surrounding Lyme Disease and tick-borne diseases.' I would just say that I'm proud to be able to have this resolution in front of us and it is important that the people in the State of Maine understand the treatments and understand the problems with that. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Diamond.

Senator **DIAMOND**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. Very briefly, I too rise and applaud the work of the Lyme Disease Awareness network. It's one of their biggest struggles, to let people know, especially the medical community, what this Lyme Disease really is all about. We have two people in the back of the Chamber that you met yesterday;

Bob and Barb Murray from Windham, who have been working tirelessly on this. I just wanted to thank them publicly. Thank you, Madame President.

JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ENACT THE LYME AND TICK-BORNE DISEASE PREVENTION, EDUCATION, AND RESEARCH ACT OF 2007

H.P. 1318

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the President of the United States and the United States Congress as follows:

WHEREAS, Lyme disease is a common but frequently misunderstood illness that, if not caught early and treated properly, can cause serious health problems; and

WHEREAS, Lyme disease is a bacterial infection that is usually transmitted by a tick bite, and early signs of infection may include a rash and flu-like symptoms such as fever, muscle aches, headaches and fatigue; and

WHEREAS, although Lyme disease can be treated with antibiotics if caught early, the disease often goes undetected because it mimics other illnesses or may be misdiagnosed and, if untreated, can lead to severe heart, neurological, eye and joint problems because the bacteria can affect many different organs and organ systems; and

WHEREAS, although Lyme disease accounts for 95% of all vector-borne infections in the United States, the ticks that spread the disease also spread other diseases such as ehrlichiosis, babesiosis and anaplasmosis; and

WHEREAS, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicates that the reported cases of Lyme disease are only 10% of actual cases that meet its surveillance criteria; and

WHEREAS, the persistence of symptomatology in many patients without reliable testing makes treatment of patients more difficult; and

WHEREAS, the Lyme and Tick-Borne Disease Prevention, Education, and Research Act of 2007 has been introduced in the 110th United States Congress as H.R. 741; and

WHEREAS, the Lyme and Tick-Borne Disease Prevention, Education, and Research Act of 2007 would advance the treatment of, and cure for, Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases by expanding federal efforts concerning prevention, education, treatment and research activities related to Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases by providing authorization

for the appropriation of \$20,000,000 for each of the federal fiscal years 2008 to 2012 for these activities; and

WHEREAS, this legislation would also require the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services to annually report to the United States Congress on these activities and make recommendations for further research and education and would establish Tick-Borne Diseases Advisory Committee within the Office of the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, on behalf of the people we represent, respectfully urge and request that the President of the United States and the United States Congress enact the Lyme and Tick-Borne Disease Prevention, Education. and Research Act of 2007, which is currently pending in the United States Congress as H.R. 741 and any subsequent companion bill passed in the United States Senate; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and to each Member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.
