Emergency Measure

An Act To Clarify Confidentiality in Child Protective Proceedings S.P. 828 L.D. 2161 (C "A" S-406)

This being an Emergency Measure and having received the affirmative vote of 33 Members of the Senate, with no Senators having voted in the negative, and 33 being more than two-thirds of the entire elected Membership of the Senate, was **PASSED TO BE ENACTED** and having been signed by the President Pro Tem, was presented by the Secretary to the Governor for his approval.

Senator **BRANNIGAN** of Cumberland was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the Record.

Senator BRANNIGAN: Thank you, Madame President. I hope that what I'm going to say is for all of us. I believe it is. I don't know if everybody saw the press releases vesterday from the Commissioner of Education and our Commissioner of Mental Health and the Department of Human Services. The changes in the Medicaid rules that are coming to us are going to be absolutely catastrophic for our safety net, for the mentally ill, for those who are aged, and other services that we give to those in need. We, those of us who work in this kind of human service field where Medicaid is used, thought we had these stalled or delayed. These rules are starting to take effect March 1st and July 1st. There is not even time to begin to get ready even if we had some way to get ready. We thought we had a moratorium to get a delay until we could work on them, understand them, and maybe change some of them. Congress agreed but they attached it to the S-Chip bill. As you know, President Bush vetoed the S-Chip bill and by doing that he did away with all of the work that we had done and Congress had done to put a moratorium on these rule changes. It is a Medicaid rule, CMS rule. I am asking everyone, and this is not just us, across this country. We were more aware than others because we use Medicaid more than others, which most of us think is a very wise thing, to have the Federal government help out 2-1 in our insurance things and other care for the disabled. Other states now realize what it is going to do to them too. We believe there is a movement underway but we need to get another moratorium either on the Iraq bill or on the stimulus package, which I think is in the works. We need to really let our Congress people know. We need to let D's and R's, especially since the R's are very important in the Senate, how serious this is. If you haven't seen the news release from yesterday, please ask for it. The numbers are staggering. The losses are in the hundreds of millions of dollars. It's not only that, but our system of care for the mentally ill, for example, the homes are in and getting help from are going to be done away with because of the unbundling. I won't go into it all. Just tell them we have to have some time. We have to have a delay. I hope you will. This weekend would be a wonderful time for you to contact all four of our representatives in Washington and ask them to just help delay the Medicaid rules. Thank you.

Senator **MARTIN** of Aroostook was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate off the Record.

Senator RAYE: Thank you, Madame President. I just wanted to echo the comments of both the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Brannigan, and the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Martin, and to emphasize that all four members of the Maine Congressional Delegation are onboard to try to slow this train down. It has an extremely serious impact on our State budget. It has an extremely serious impact on other State's budgets across the country. The fiscal impact for the General Fund is \$45 million, further complicating our work that we have ahead of us. As the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Martin, mentioned, the impact on the community is much greater. It takes up to more like \$185 million. I wanted to just point out that one of the most serious impacts is in regards to special education and the Federal mandate with respect to special education. That is that our communities will still be required to provide all of the services, the transportation, etcetera under the Federal mandate but this is a cost shift directly to the property tax payers. I think that we need to be, all of us, vigilant but I do take heart in the knowledge that our Congressional Delegation, on a bi-partisan basis, is united to see what can be done at the Federal level to make sure that we don't take enormous hit.
