Committee Recommendations on the Governor's Emergency Supplemental

Budget Bill (LR 1045)

We are writing to provide the recommendations of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor, Commerce, Research and Economic Development on those portions of the Governor's Biennial Budget Bill (LR 1045) that were considered in the public hearing on January 24, 2013. We have reviewed and discussed these initiatives and appreciate your consideration of our recommendations and comments.

The committee voted on January 30th to unanimously support each initiative and language part under the jurisdiction of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor, Commerce, Research and Economic Development, except for one item. After a lengthy discussion, the committee tabled one item on page LCED-9, Rehabilitation Services 0799, reference #395 (initiative to reduce funding in amount of \$20,000 for contracted services with the Maine Center on Deafness).

Several members of the committee expressed serious concerns about the potential impact of the reduction on those individuals that rely on the civil rights advocacy services provided by the advocates at the Maine Center on Deafness. The committee tabled the discussion in order to provide the Department of Labor with additional time to review their budget and possibly identify other sources for the reduction in funding and to report back to the committee. The committee will vote on this tabled item on Thursday February 7th at 1:00pm, the earliest date that an ASL interpreter could be available for the committee.

Attached please find a marked-up version of the initiatives and language parts in the Governor's Emergency Supplemental Budget under the committee's jurisdiction. Thank you for your consideration of our comments and for your patience regarding our deliberations on the remaining table item.
