Please accept this memo in response to your request for Supplemental Budget report backs pursuant to Joint Rule 314 for the Department of Corrections. These recommendations reflect the unanimous support of the 9 members present and voting at today's work session.

Department of Corrections

In today's work session the committee identified and accepted final recommendations, including adjustments in initiatives proposed in LD 46, as well as some savings reached by deappropriations from other initiatives. These proposed recommendations spread the burden across many areas in an attempt to maintain current corrections services and keep all of the current units at Charleston Correctional Facility open for this fiscal year. Keeping all units at Charleston open at this time requires the support and flexibility of the staff, who have voluntarily agreed to shift schedules to manage the changes there, including burning wood during the 3rd shift. The Department of Corrections has also confirmed its ability to push out the accreditation process for the Maine State Prison and Bolduc until November 2009. In addition to the deappropriations identified in LD 46, the department and committee were also able to find additional savings in certain utility contracts, equipment and supplies. Again, thank you for your patience and flexibility in this process. We believe that that the extra time and work will be worthwhile, as it will give the Legislature and the State Board of Corrections the opportunity to

look carefully at the entire Department of Corrections system and its mission in future deliberations on corrections services.

Attached, please see the report back worksheets for DOC and part of MEMA, which includes a deappropriation that is used to achieve the committee's target for DOC. Please let us know if you have any questions.
