Report on Supplemental Budget LD 1671

The Judiciary Committee is pleased to provide this memo as the report of our supplemental budget discussions about the Office of the Attorney General, the Maine Human Rights Commission, the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission (MITSC), the Maine Indigent Legal Services Commission, the Judicial Branch, Pine Tree Legal Assistance and the Baxter Compensation Fund (Part D of LD 1671). As shown on the attached report, the Judiciary Committee voted unanimously in favor of all recommendations, and we approve of Part D.

We would like to take this opportunity to make a few comments. We sincerely appreciate the effort these entities have made to meet the reduction goals. Many of these cuts are deep and will hurt the missions of these entities. Most of our votes were taken reluctantly, but we recognize the fiscal circumstances and know that cuts are necessary.

With regard to the Office of the Attorney General, we would like to bring to your attention that LD 1671 contains an adjustment to the Victims' Compensation program based on revenue projections approved by the Revenue Forecasting Committee in December 2009. The Committee understands that at this time, before the adjustment proposed in LD 1671, the program has just sufficient revenue in the Victims' Compensation Fund balance to support the program at its original level of allocation. It is anticipated that the Office of the Attorney General will request an allotment increase of \$89,269 in FY10 and in FY11 an increase of \$112,427 at a later time through the Financial Order process.

With regard to the Maine Indian Tribal-State Commission, we are in the midst of working with MITSC, the Tribes and the Governor's Office to develop a budget consultation process that appropriately reflects the unique role MITSC was designed to serve as a collaborative organization of governments, approved by Congress to continually evaluate and help improve the relationships identified in the Maine Implementing Act; it is not a typical "commission" or agency funded by the State. We will soon request that your Committee review our proposal, but we will be able to use our own bill, LD 445, An Act to Improve Tribal-State Relations, to enact the language.

With regard to the Maine Indigent Legal Services Commission, we understand that the reductions are based on a three-month trend of fewer criminal filings. If this trend continues, the funding reduction may be appropriate. If, however, the number of cases in which representation is constitutionally-required increases, we will be advocating for additional resources for the Commission, and we expect the Executive and the Legislature to ensure that the necessary funding is provided.

We wrote to you separately on Part UU, which is within the jurisdiction of the Health and Human Services to review.

Justification:

Pine Tree Legal Assistance has experienced an 18% decline in state funding since 2006; this additional 5% reduction will compound the challenges facing the organization, which faces an 18% operating deficit (all funding sources) in CY10. Pine Tree is Maine's only provider of free legal services to low-income Maine residents of all ages who require legal advocacy to address core needs, including housing, income, personal safety and related concerns. It is also a "last resort" provider when legal aid services are reduced or discontinued as a result of funding cuts or grant losses to other agencies. Currently, Pine Tree only has the capacity to respond to 20% of requests for assistance from eligible Maine residents. The loss of an additional \$13,200 will result in more than 30 low income families around the State without access to critical legal assistance. It may also impact the organization's ability to leverage federal grants requiring local matching funds.
