Senator **GAGNON**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate, this Joint Order is to recall from the Governor's desk the bill concerning harness racing, which we have heard a lot about. As most of you are aware, there has been quite a bit of activity related to gambling in the State of Maine. I think most of us have been aware of that. THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Brennan.

Senator **BRENNAN**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. We are very fortunate today to have Kristy here because she represents courage in the form that many of us would like to have on a regular basis. What she is doing is extraordinarily courageous. Let me tell you why. Last year, this body, this Legislature, passed, for the first time, a mental health parody bill. In 2003, we finally recognized that mental illness is comparable to other physical ailments and we finally recognize that by passing insurance parody in the State of Maine. That was in 2003. That shows the type of stigma that people with mental illness have lived with for hundreds of years in this country. That is why what she is doing is so courageous. She has already gone to 14 different states to talk about the mental illness she has grappled with in her life and to be here today. It truly is courageous.

Just to show the depths of some of the stigma we still have in the State of Maine, we are the only state that says in their constitution that if you are under guardianship for mental illness, you are not allowed to vote. In 2000, that issue went to the voters in the State of Maine and we asked them to repeal that and to allow persons who are under guardianship for mental illness to vote. It failed, 60% to 40%. 60% of the voters still felt that it was inappropriate for persons with mental illness that are under guardianship to vote in this state, even though we allow everybody else under guardianship in this state to vote. Again, it is only the State of Maine that has this in their constitution. Fortunately, a Federal Court Judge overruled that and now persons with mental illness who are under guardianship can vote in the state.

But that was in 2000. In 2003, we finally passed mental health parody. The stigma surrounding mental health still persists widely in this state today and across the country. Again, I feel privileged to be able to stand here today and to meet and be able to talk to a woman who has shown such courage and made such

a commitment to go not only to our state, but across the country, and help us understand more about the stigma and the issues around mental illness that face all of us. Thank you very much.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Franklin, Senator Woodcock.

Senator **WOODCOCK**: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I'm certain that each of us would much rather be out sledding today across Moosehead Lake or the environs, and in order to do so and not be concerned about some of the liabilities that are connected to the sledding business, we would, today, move forward with this bill, which would remove some of those concerns, particularly for the exceptional snowmobile clubs that we have in our state. I would like to take this opportunity to particularly thank my colleague, the good Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Davis, for his foresight in seeing that this bill needed immediate passage and his diligence in working it through the process so that several hundred million dollars that we realize from sledding in the winter season of Maine and the tens of thousands of people who participate in this outdoor activity will be able to go forth this morning and from now on during our winter period without the concerns that liability bring upon them. So as we go forth today in this minus 12 degree weather, we go forth with the reassurance that the snowmobilers of Maine are going to be able to participate this winter, realize the income from that, and be able to enjoy the activity without those concerns. Thank you very much, Madame President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Bennett.

Senator BENNETT: Thank you, Madame President, and fellow members of the Senate. Like many other members of the Senate, I represent a rural area of Maine. This issue is, of course, very important to my constituents. I've heard from scores of people on this issue. In fact, I've heard more on this issue than I think on any other issue during this legislature. It's hard to consider an activity of more significance to the people of Maine during the wintertime than snowmobiling. I think it is, indeed, propitious that this legislature can start its Second Regular Session by addressing such a real, tangible, important, and momentous issue for the people that we represent. Snowmobiling provides over a half a billion dollars of activity to our state's economy every year, at a time of year when it's desperately needed. Snowmobiling provides a much needed outlet for cabin fever for our constituents. Snowmobiling also provides access for many of our constituents, who wouldn't otherwise get such access, to Maine's natural wonders. I, too, want to just express my gratitude on behalf of my constituents to the Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Davis, for his leadership on this issue and putting this bill forward. I also want to add my gratitude to the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Pendleton, for her committee's work on expediting this process and getting this bill moved along very quickly. It is, indeed, as I said, a propitious bi-partisan beginning to this session. I thank them both and I thank the legislature, on behalf of my constituents, for addressing this issue. Thank you very much, Madame President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Martin.

Senator **MARTIN**: Thank you, Madame President. I suspect there is probably no one in this state whose area has more trails in the entire state than Senate District 1, soon to be Senate District 35. I find it interesting that the two previous Senators have failed to mention the sponsor of the bill.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Davis.

Senator **DAVIS**: Thank you very much, Madame President. I guess that I probably could dispute with the good Senator from Aroostook, Senator Martin, over who has the most trails. I would just like to thank my good friends, Senator Bennett of Oxford and Senator Woodcock of Franklin, for their kind words of praise. It is gratifying and very nice to have people speak well of you. I must say that it certainly wasn't an effort by myself, to say the very least.

A year ago, I got a call from a fellow by the name of Fred Trask in Milo, Maine. He sells insurance. Fred told me that there was a problem in the industry. I put a bill in to help correct this problem. The bill didn't fair well at first, but over the course of our legislative sessions and with the help of the chair and the members of the Judiciary Committee, it faired better as time went along. There is a lot of things that happened along the way. Certainly Bob Myers, who is in the back of the chamber this morning, deserves the biggest bulk of any praise that needs to be handed around. He is head of the Maine Snowmobilers' Association, as you all well know, and he was very diligent, over and over, working hard with countless meetings and contacts, to make this happen. The Governor, himself, this morning told me that he would like to hook the supplemental budget to this legislation because it went through so quick. That maybe he could do that, maybe he couldn't.

Mostly, Madame President, I'd like to thank the volunteers that work the snowmobile trails, both in the good Senator from Aroostook, Senator Martin's district, my district, and in districts all across the state. This industry is the lifeblood in the winter time. The economic lifeblood, to say the very least. If it were not for people giving of themselves, with little or scant help from anywhere else, and people giving their time in building this industry, it would not be there.

With all that said, Madame President, I thank you. I thank you, too, Madame President, for getting this right through. You deserve the praise for that. This doesn't happen often with any bill. I thank you for that. Thank you, colleagues.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Blais.

Senator **BLAIS**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. It is a pleasure to be here today. In fact, it was a pleasure just to make it through the parking lot and into the building this morning. I certainly am not sure that I share the sentiments of the good Senator from Franklin, Senator Woodcock, about being out sledding today. I may have a little bit of warm weather blood in me.

I'd like to not repeat, but share in, the comments of my fellow Senators today in thanking the Senator from Piscataquis, Senator Davis, you, Madame President, and everyone here in the Senate that has been instrumental in bringing this bill forward for us today. I know that the passage of this bill, the enactment of this bill, is critically important to the people of my rural district. One other thing that I would like to add, however, is that this bill, I think, is recognition by this body and by the full legislature of the importance of tort reform in ensuring the affordability in our insurance systems. I look forward to seeing more legislation come forward in this regard. I would ask for a roll call, Madame President. Thank you.

Senator BLAIS of Kennebec requested a Roll Call.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Turner.

Senator **TURNER**: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. I do hope I have an opportunity to vote on this matter before the snow melts.
