I always admired this couple because they came to church and spent more time talking before church than I think they did afterwards. They had a wonderful friendship and a wonderful relationship. After church they would take their wives and go out for dinner. Well, during the election they kept right on talking and after the election was over, Guy had won, they proceeded to be good friends, went out to dinner, and went to Florida. What a wonderful relationship between two people who disagreed on many things, but who maintained their friendship.  Let us pray. All mighty God, we seek Your guidance as we begin this day. We're conscience of our responsibilities to serve all the people of Maine as we meet day after day. The challenges are great, the needs of the people are considerable, and resources are scarce. Help us to listen to one another, to be realistic in our expectations for our work, and to be fair and compassionate in our decision making as we work together for the good of all the people of Maine.  We pray again today for Your watchcare over those who serve our country in Iraq and we pray for th
