Our feeling was that there is a clear danger with some of these pyrotechnics and we wanted to make sure, regardless of whether it's inside or outside, that people remain safe. I would add that we had zero testimony from any communities that were saying the bill, as proposed, was not sufficient or they would not be able to work within its confines.
