JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING MARCH 8, 2016 AS ACCESS TO JUSTICE DAY AND EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR MAINE'S JUSTICE ACTION GROUP

WHEREAS, Maine's Justice Action Group, founded in 1995, is a judge-led coalition of leaders from Maine's legal community who are passionate about ensuring for the people of Maine equal access to civil justice; and

WHEREAS, the coalition members include representatives of the state and federal judiciary, the Legislature, nonprofit civil legal aid providers, the University of Maine School of Law, the Maine Bar Foundation, the Maine State Bar Association, the Maine Trial Lawyers Association, private practice attorneys and others; and

WHEREAS, key initiator Judge Frank Coffin described the Justice Action Group as a catalyst, something introduced in small quantities that produces great change; and

WHEREAS, equal access to justice is a bedrock principle of a free, constitutional society, but no system of laws and constitutional protections can be effective if only those who can afford a private practice attorney have access to justice; and

WHEREAS, providing equal access to justice has tangible, widespread benefits for Maine's families, children, schools, communities, businesses, charities and government; and

WHEREAS, legal issues profoundly affect basic human needs such as shelter, sustenance, safety from violence, health and child protection; and

WHEREAS, the need for civil legal aid and pro bono representation for low-income and vulnerable Maine people remains acute; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-seventh Legislature now assembled in the Second Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, pause on this Access to Justice Day to acknowledge and express our appreciation and strong support for Maine's civil legal aid providers and private practice attorneys who provide pro bono services for those otherwise unable to afford legal representation; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a suitable copy of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Justice Action Group.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Volk.

Senator VOLK: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I would like to introduce a Joint Resolution recognizing the Maine Justice Action Group's Access to Justice Day. One of the founding principles of our country is the idea of justice for all, but increasingly many poor and vulnerable citizens are unable to access our courts and administrative systems. The Legislature has created laws to protect people from domestic violence, from unfair evictions, and from unscrupulous business practices that often prey upon our elderly citizens. These laws are ineffective if the people who need them are unable to access them. One of the things that has struck me as I've served on the Judiciary Committee the last year and a half or so is learning more about the rise in family court matters and how that really puts some of our most vulnerable citizens at risk; particularly at risk for an uneven representation in court. However, Maine's judges, lawyers, and legal services providers continue to work together to provide legal protection for those most in need. Countless hours of pro bono services are provided to Maine citizens each year. We are here to acknowledge and commend those who are providing services and to gain a better understanding of the need for effective civil legal assistance in our state.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Lincoln, Senator Johnson.

Senator **JOHNSON**: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, there is a bedrock principle in our country that this Resolve refers to of equal access to justice and unfortunately far too many people don't have the representation that enables them to fully access that, to be able to, when they enter our court system, have someone who is an advocate that knows the rules of evidence, that knows all of what it takes to navigate a very formal environment in our courts even if they have the better case to prevail. I am very glad that we are today recognizing the work of people who dedicate themselves to ensuring that the services that are needed to bring people access to that justice are being advanced through their work day to day. Senator **LIBBY** of Androscoggin was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the Record.

Senator LIBBY: Thank you, Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, I'm pleased to welcome guests to the State House today, the Lewiston High School Boys Class A State Championship Soccer Team. I'd like to just offer a few remarks for the record. This is Lewiston's first State Class A Boys Soccer Championship and it is a monumental accomplishment for a community that is undergone enormous change over the last 30 years in terms of economics and in terms of demographics. Last year's championship team is made up of Congolese Americans, Kenyan Americans, Turkish Americans, German Americans, and Somalia Americans. As you well know, coming from a community that is undergone such enormous change in the last several years, bringing a team together to accomplish a State Championship victory is an amazing accomplishment. In fact, seven members of this championship team came from the same refugee camp in Africa. They are an undefeated nationally rank squad. There is actually a documentary film maker who is here today who's a Lewiston High School graduate and an alumni of the soccer team, Ian Clough, who's doing a documentary on this amazing group of young men. Coach Mike McGraw is a real key part to this team's success and in the documentary that is being produced Coach McGraw is quoted as doing the following: these Somalia players, when they started, were getting ready on different ends of the fields and Coach McGraw knew that was an issue right from the get-go. Coach McGraw said, "I want you guys to come over here in the middle. This is how a team plays and this is how I want you to be on the field and off the field, together." This filmmaker credits McGraw as the key that helped knit this group and their families and neighbors together. All of the kids on the team used words to describe him as a father figure. He couldn't be more important to the refugee community and to the Lewiston community as a whole. With that, it's my great honor to welcome the State Championship team to the State Senate today and thank you very much, Mr. President.
