THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Franklin, Senator Woodcock.

Senator **WOODCOCK**: Thank you, Madame President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. We've heard much conversation about this particular bill. That conversation has, at times, focused upon an agenda which behind this proposal. Today I would ask you to consider that the reason why we should not be supportive of this particular bill has nothing to do with the agenda, if it does, in fact, exist. Point one, this bill will place a terrific burden on the probate court system of this state. This is an unnecessary burden, at a time when the probate system cannot afford to do so. Secondly, and most importantly from my perspective, this bill is unnecessary. All we need to do, all anyone needs to do, is create a will and all of the concerns addressed in this particular bill will be mollified. A will made out to leave portions of you estate, all of your estate, to an heir will take care of this bill and any of its concerns. The probate court system does not need an extra burden. The will will clarify and take care of all of the concerns that the bill has put forth and cast the agenda aside. These are the common sense able reasons why this bill should be opposed and I shall be doing so. Thank you, Madame President.

THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Pendleton.

Senator **PENDLETON**: Thank you, Madame President. I respectfully understand the good Senator from Franklin, Senator Woodcock. I would like to say that, first and foremost, this bill address people who die without a will. Even though we all would like for everyone to have a will, and it is the smart thing to do, there will always be people that die without a will. This bill addresses those people. According to an ABC news poll in July 2003, 50% of Americans don't have wills and only 42% have living wills or healthcare proxies. That's a problem that we all have, not any particular person. I think that as far as clogging up the courts, if 50% of us don't have wills in the first place, I don't see how it's going to make an awful amount of difference if we pass this bill to allow people to register if they don't have a will. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Sagadahoc, Senator Mayo.

Senator MAYO: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. I rise in support of this particular piece of legislation, L.D. 1579. While I understand what the good Senator from Franklin, Senator Woodcock, was attempting to say and promote, in my former life, and yes there is a former life for most of us in this body, I dealt on a number of occasions with a situation involving this particular philosophical piece of legislation. Believe me, it was normally a very unpleasant situation to have to tell a domestic partner that he or she could have nothing to do with funeral arrangements. In one instance, to tell a domestic partner of 18 years that he could not come into the funeral home and have anything to do with the funeral. He could not be in attendance at the funeral. Yes, the good Senator from Franklin, Senator Woodcock, is correct that a will could have done something about that particular situation. As the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Pendleton, stated a few minutes ago, 50% of the people in this country do not have a will, for whatever reason. I would urge support of this to correct a situation that has long needed correction in this state. Thank you.

What it does is now contains a domestic partner registry. It will be housed in the Office of Health Data and Program Management in the Bureau of Health. THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes	the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Blais.

Senator **BLAIS**: Thank you, Madame President and fellow members of the Senate. I think it's important to get on record what this piece of legislation does. It extends full state benefits to contract employees, those 1099 employees. This means that contract employees would be eligible, under this legislation, for sick leave, holiday pay, the retirement program, training opportunities, and the like. This is definitely plowing some new ground in our state. As an employer, I would be very concerned to see this being a model for something that would be moving out into the private sector.

In addition to that, there is a committee amendment that states that in order for the Bureau of General Services to be able to manage the accounting associated with this that they would be adding three senior staff positions at a cost of \$631,000 in the 2004-2005 budget. In addition to that, this legislation carries a

fiscal note in 2004-2005 of \$1.8 million to cover the additional cost of providing these benefits to contract employees. In 2005-2006, \$4.9 million and it is projected to be 2006-2007 at \$4.9 million. I would urge my colleagues to vote in opposition to this, particularly when you consider the difficult financial straights that our state is in currently. Thank you very much, Madame President.

Senator **EDMONDS**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. Precisely for that reason, I believe that if I'm working next to someone who's doing exactly the same job that I am doing, working at it as hard as I am, and I'm a state employee and they are a contract worker, they deserve the same benefits. It's sort of a fairness issue for me. I'd appreciate your vote on the majority report. Thank you.
