2023 Legislative Annual Report For The Maine Connectivity Authority + Connect Maine Authority

Greetings President Jackson and Speaker Talbot Ross

Please see the attached annual report to the legislature as required by statute. In summary, I am excited to report that

- Since 2018, Maine has funded \$98M of broadband projects covering 64,000 locations, with the bulk of those in the last 18 months.
- On January 20th, 2023, The MCA board approved \$34M of grants (the single largest investment for broadband in Maine ever) to 12 regional scale public-private partnerships through the first round of our Connect the Ready infrastructure grants. These awards will provide service to 16,000 locations by 2025 and leverage \$17M of private investment.
- MCA is currently deploying and managing \$195M in funding while facilitating federally mandated planning processes to inform an additional infusion of funds expected to be approximately \$230M.
- MCA has contracted with and is supporting Regional & Tribal Broadband partners from every region in the State to coordinate this planning work with a focus around digital equity. These thirteen organizations are great resources for you and your constituents.
- In January 2023 the Maine Connectivity Authority filed 129,000 location and availability challenges (20% of all serviceable broadband locations in the state) where the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) thought there was service, but MCA contends there is not any. The maps that result from the challenge process will form the basis for the federal BEAD funding allocations.

Dugal also served as the Executive Director of the Camden/Rockport/Lincolnville Chamber of Commerce. During his tenure he was honored with Chamber Executive of the Year by the Maine State Chamber of Commerce in 2002 and received honors as Restaurateur of the Year in 2000 from the Maine Restaurant Association. Greg Dugal was also honored in 2009 to become a member of the Maine Tourism Association Hall of Fame and to receive the Governor's Award for Tourism Excellence in 2016. Greg also served on the Board of Directors for the Convention and Visitor's Bureau for the Greater Portland Area; the Maine Tourism Association; the International Society of Hotel Association Executives, where he was volunteer chair. He also served on the Board of the American Hotel and Lodging Association for two terms and was past-Chair of the Maine Tourism Commission. What a resume, Greg. We have enjoyed many hours of working together to help Maine's hospitality industry, including the successful effort to restore the Maine Tip Credit. Servers across the state had your cell number on speed

dial. You were always available to take their calls, and mine, day and night. We will always remember your extraordinary commitment to these hardworking Mainers. You are an industry legend, Greg. Thank you for your faithful service. May the Lord bless you with a fabulous retirement.

Senator CURRY: Thank you, Mr. President. I want to stand and recognize Greg Dugal as an incredible asset to the state of Maine.
