Senator **KEIM**: Thank you, Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, it's unnecessary to stand and speak on a bill that had unanimous support but this one is fun and sometimes it's nice to celebrate the things that don't go through with any political reasons behind them. So, I am standing in support of this legislation. The bill idea was brought to me by my constituent, Myles Felch, Curator and Staff Geologist at the Maine Mineral and Gem Museum located in Bethel. Myles did a tremendous amount of work drumming up support for this bill from other legislators, which is a testament to his passion for rocks, geology, and the State of Maine. Myles started his testimony in the State and Local Government Committee by giving us all a guick geology lesson. He explained that Granitic Pegmatite is a rock that has the composition of granite but with exceeding large crystals. Some pegmatites also contain rare mineral species, such as Maine's state gemstone, tourmaline. Pegmatites also contain several quartz varieties, including amethyst, rose, and smoky varieties. Granitic Pegmatite's importance to Maine

comes from its prevalence in the state. It can be found in at least 14 of Maine's counties and is still being guarried in many Maine towns, including Auburn, Newry, Paris, and Poland, Pegmatites have brought, and continue to bring. Maine international recognition. In 1820, the year of Maine's statehood, the first discovery of gem Tourmaline was made at Mt. Mica in Paris. The Roebling apatite, considered one of the great mineral specimens in the world, from the Pulsifer Quarry in Auburn is displayed at the Smithsonian Institution. Some of these pegmatites in Maine also host economic quantities of spodumene, a mineral resource that is essential to the development of Lithium-ion battery, which are key to meeting the demands of energy and technological development. This legislation sailed through committee with the support of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation, and Forestry. This is because it makes perfect sense Maine's state rock should be Granitic Pegmatite. It has significant historical significance to the State and the potential to be a critical part of our future. I thank you in voting for this measure today.

He was inducted into the Maine Central Institute Hall of Fame in 1989. Mr. Cianchette will be long remembered and sadly missed by his family and friends and all those whose lives he touched.

With the construction business a bit quitter in the off-season, Ken used his GI Bill to become a private pilot. This quickly became a lifelong passion, one shared with many members of his family and business, and came in handy while courting his future wife as they were known to fly to baseball games. In 1949, he married Nina "Evie" Lancaster with whom he built a home, raised five children, and enjoyed hosting large gatherings for family and friends. He lived in Pittsfield for nearly 80 years before moving to North Yarmouth. In addition to forming one of Maine's most wellknown and established construction companies and inventing tools to make life in the construction industry a bit easier, he was also incredibly giving of his time as a Trustee of the Owl's Head Transportation Museum, the Pittsfield Town Council, and the SAD 53 School Board, amongst numerous other boards. He also served as President of the Associated General Contractors of Maine and on the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, as Chairman of an advisory council for the Maine Department of Commerce and Industry.
