THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Washington, Senator Moore.

Senator **MOORE:** Thank you, Madam President. I just wanted to speak just a few minutes regarding this bill that is before you as a divided report.

I am reminded an anthem is defined as a rousing or uplifting song identified with a particular group, body, or a cause. And that's us Mainers, for sure. Research tells us that Maine has four musical pieces adopted by the State of Maine. First, the State of Maine, which was adopted as the state song in 1937. It was written and composed by Roger Vinton Snow, who died in 1953. This piece, although it has lyrics, has a march tempo, and while it's a strong piece of music, it sounds quite dated.

In 2012, the Dirigo March was unanimously approved by the Maine State Legislature as the official state march. Leo J. Pepin, an Augusta native, composed this march, a musical score with no lyrics, in 1961. More recently, and I think we all remember this one, those of us that were around in 2019, the Ghost of Paul Revere folk band had their ballad, the Ballad of the 20th Century, confirmed as the official state ballad on June 7, 2019. The ballad focuses on the 20th Maine Regiment's crucial role in winning the Battle of Gettysburg during the Civil War. Again, the ballad is excellent, but does not address the present day.

In 2021, the Legislature adopted Terry Swett's My Sweet Maine, which was written to celebrate Maine's bicentennial in 2020 as the state song of the 21st century. Welcome Home offers something different from the examples listed above. It underscores a multitude of both historical and modern characteristics that make our state appealing and recognized by others as special and unique. There are mentions of what Mainers and the tourists see as valuable and precious, even mentioning that Mainers are the hardest working folks you'll ever know. There's definitely room in Welcome Home -- for Welcome Home in Maine as a state anthem. Did you know that Tennessee has 12 official state songs - the most in the country - and actually an official bicentennial rap song?

When you hear the song, Welcome Home, you will see how it

is -- hey, it's Tennessee, what do you expect -- you will see how it is a positive song, upbeat, catchy, acknowledges the Wabanaki heritage and history, and embraces many locations, occupations, activities, and groups of people, more of what is needed in today's world. It even mentioned that little known behavior of rolling the windows down when driving into Maine, which apparently is more common than I realized.

Gordon Thomas Ward, the songwriter, actually performed the song itself before the committee when he was presenting -- when I presented the bill. I promise you I'm not going to sing it, so that's not my intent today. I have asked that the lyrics be distributed to the Senators, they are not quite on the desk yet, they will be there soon. I'll just read you one of the verses. It says:

My home state has a different state of mind. When I have to leave, I miss her every time. From the harbors to the highlands, from Aroostook to the bays, this corner of our country's doin' fine. And you mighta heard you can't get theyah from heyah - I can't even pronounce it right - but we'll point you in the direction, deayah. From the forests of Paul Bunyan, to our wild blueberry fields, yes, Dirigo won't disappoint you theyah.

Thank you, Madam President.
