Senator **RAFFERTY** of York moved the Senate **ACCEPT** the Majority **OUGHT TO PASS AS AMENDED** Report, in concurrence.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair now recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Libby.

Senator **LIBBY:** Thank you, Madam President, Men and Women of the Senate. Good morning still. I just had to check. We opposed -- some Members of the Republican caucus in the Education Committee opposed this bill. Just a brief note about it.

The Educators for Maine is a competitive, merit-based, forgivable loan for Maine students pursuing careers in education, speech pathology, and childcare. And these students plan to live and work in Maine, so it sounds pretty good. I think the problem that we had was that there was this EASE grant that was received -- federal funding that was received for provision of mental health services. Well, some of the money from the EASE grant is being put into this bill before it's even law. So, in other words, apparently, we've had this ease grant for two years and the money hasn't been allocated or sent anywhere. And this is typical of what I've been seeing in a lot of allocations lately and, in fact, the State Auditor made it a point of saying that there have been a lot of these kinds of allocations that aren't properly or correctly provided with the correct paperwork and the authority over the money being moved is loose, I guess that's the best way to put it. So, our concern was that, you know, adding school counselors to receive aid in a postbaccalaureate degree program - that sounds great, I don't think that we're necessarily opposed to that - but currently, in current law, the postbaccalaureate aid is a competitive grant and it goes to educators. It goes to teachers, it doesn't go to specialists, and we're only choosing one specialist in this case and adding them to the law.

So, yes, there is a need for school counselors, I don't think there's any doubt that there's a shortage there, but the funding that's coming from the EASE grant, which was that federal grant, is said to be covering two years of the competitive grant that we're getting for the school counselors. And again, that -- I don't know if we're just, you know, shifting around money willy-nilly or what, but that's typically not the way a federal grant would be utilized for something where the law hasn't even been passed yet.

So, that was our concerns, and I appreciate you listening, and I would urge Members to vote against the pending motion.

On motion by Senator **HARRINGTON** of York, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Rafferty.

Senator **RAFFERTY:** Thank you, Madam President. I'd just like to speak just to kind of make some clarifications here.

So, this is a department bill that was -- we've been asked to

look at, and it is definitely targeting a need. So, this whole program, in terms of the financial assistance, is under the Educators for Maine program and that is overseen by FAME. Originally just for teachers as was mentioned but in '99, we added a group that was needed at the time was speech pathologists. They were added in. Then in 2003, there was another need, and we added in childcare candidates. So, this particular -- right now, we're asking that it add counselors because there's been a statewide report and concerns expressed that the mental health of our students in our schools have a desperate need for counselors. They want to help students address the multiple concerns that they're dealing with and making counselors eligible to receive the financial assistance may help attract needed candidates.

And I ask again that we support the Ought to Pass as Amended motion. Thank you.

**THE PRESIDENT:** The Chair recognizes the Senator from Lincoln, Senator Reny.

Senator **RENY:** Thank you, Madam President. You know, when I saw this bill on the calendar, I was worried we are going to have a different kind of floor debate, and I'm really thankful that we're not, honestly.

I just want to point out, I guess, as a school counselor, that school counselors are absolutely a crucial part of the education team, so to speak, and I just -- I won't go into the whole history of what school counselors are and all the things we do, but I just want to point out that school counselors are responsible - and I'm talking school counselors, 075 certification for the State of Maine, they work with the whole school, not just specific groups or specific populations. They are a tier 1 intervention, for those who are really into school stuff, sometimes tier 2 because we are specialists, but, you know, we are teaching classes, we are working with everyone, and we are needed desperately throughout the state and they need more of us.

So, I'm definitely going to be supporting this motion. Thank you.
