Prayer by Venerable Tenzin Dase of Bates College Multifaith Chaplaincy in Lewiston.

VENERABLE TENZIN DASEL: Thank you to the President of the Senate, Mattie, as she told me I should refer to her, and thank you all for your service in being here serving our -- this great state of Maine. And thank you especially to Senator Peggy Rotundo for the invitation. It is my great honor and pleasure to be here with you this morning -- or as I said, almost this afternoon. But that's okay, I'm used to India time, and I used to work for the Secretary of State another lifetime ago, back in 2006 to 2008, so I know how things go politically here in the State House.

Thank you so much, really, truly, from my heart for your service because services are privilege to work for the benefit of others. It's truly a calling of great responsibility and it's something that I really, from my heart, honor and say thank you to all of you for your service in this particularly difficult time that we're in.

So, one thing I wanted to offer first was just this kind of idea that we start with this idea of having life and being alive and how wonderful it is. Really, how wonderful it is to be a human being. There are a myriad of life forms on this one planet in this great universe of ours and most life forms on this planet are not humans. Although we talk about 8 billion humans, probably there are more mosquitos than that just in the state of Maine, alone - or black flies, anyway. And so, this is the great moment that our lifetime has afforded us to be of service, of benefit, of humor, of joy, of positivity, of courage, using wisdom, which the great lady on the top of our State House reminds us of, the Lady of Wisdom, holding a flaming pine torch, which I like for old times sake, nostalgia. And so, being of service means we call to mind well, who are we serving? We're serving all sentient beings, all other human beings, all other forms of life, and we do our best. We won't always get it right, sometimes we miss the mark, but the idea of a service is coming together to learn from our own strengths and our own weaknesses with humility, with wisdom, and especially with compassion.

So, I wanted to just read an excerpt from this prayer that recalls these benefits of wisdom and compassion, and it's not really a Buddhist prayer, it's really a secular prayer, if you hear the secular call to be of service to all sentient beings.

May as many beings as there are in all directions, diseased with sufferings of body and mind, may they all attain oceans of happiness and joy through the forces of my positive acts. May the blind see sights and forever may the deaf hear sounds. And may the pregnant give birth without any pain. May the naked find clothing, the hungry food, and the thirsty water and delicious things to drink. May the poor find wealth, those stricken with grief find joy, and may the discouraged become uplifted and perfectly

steadfast. May as many limited beings as are sick be swiftly set free from sickness and may the sicknesses of wandering beings without exception never recur. May those with fear become fearless, those in bondage be released, those lacking strength become strong, and their hearts become friendly toward each other. May no limited being ever have pain nor act with negative force nor be sick nor be frightened nor be derided nor ever be depressed. By this positive force, may all limited beings without an exception rid themselves of all negative acts and always engage in what is constructive. May these heart wishes to benefit the world be fulfilled and may whatever those highest guardians have intended indeed come to bring benefit for limited beings. For as long as space remains and for as long as wandering beings remain, may we too remain for that long dispelling the sufferings of this world.

And now, we think about the joy of four unlimited qualities we call the endless wishes because like limited -- like sentient beings are without limit, these wishes, you can never develop these qualities to a point where they'd finish. So, the first one is called the immeasurable wish for loving kindness.

May all beings have happiness, and its causes and be established in immeasurable loving kindness. May all beings be freed from suffering and its causes and be established in immeasurable compassion. May all beings never be separated from the root of joy without sorrow and be established in immeasurable bliss. May all beings abide in equanimity, free from strong attachment and strong aversion and be established in immeasurable equanimity.

And now, just a short finishing meditation. This is called just an everyday meditation from the nuns of Gebchuk Nunnery in Tibet. And I brought my own little bell, which I think sounds a little bit nicer, this little bell, than yours. When you reach that place beyond thoughts, the only thing you'll find is love, and the only purpose of life becomes to ease the suffering of others, abandon all effort, find the silence beyond thoughts, then simply remain. The rest happens naturally.

**JOINT RESOLUTION
RECOGNIZING MAY 18, 2025 TO MAY 24, 2025 AS
EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES WEEK**

WHEREAS, emergency medical services are vital public services; and

WHEREAS, the members of emergency medical services teams are ready to provide lifesaving care to those in need 24 hours a day, 7 days a week; and

WHEREAS, access to quality emergency medical services dramatically improves the survival and recovery rate of those who experience sudden illness or injury; and

WHEREAS, emergency medical services have grown to fill healthcare gaps by providing important, out-of-hospital care, including preventative medicine, follow-up care and access to telemedicine; and

WHEREAS, the emergency medical services system consists of first responders, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, emergency medical dispatchers, firefighters, police officers, educators, administrators, pre-hospital nurses, emergency nurses, emergency physicians, trained members of the public and other out-of-hospital medical care providers; and

WHEREAS, the members of emergency medical services teams, whether career or volunteer, engage in thousands of hours of specialized training and continuing education to enhance their lifesaving skills; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to recognize the value and the accomplishments of emergency medical services providers by designating Emergency Medical Services Week; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, the members of the One Hundred Thirty-second Legislature now assembled in the First Special Session, pause in our deliberations to designate the week of May 18, 2025 to May 24, 2025 as Emergency Medical Services Week, with this year's 51st anniversary theme: We Care. For Everyone; and we encourage all citizens to observe this week with appropriate programs, ceremonies and activities in honor of Emergency Medical Services providers and the essential services they provide.

I'm really, really proud of the steps that we've taken thus far. I hope that through this Legislature, we will take additional steps to support emergency medical services here in the state of Maine.

WHEREAS, thousands of new ALS cases are reported every year and estimates show that every 90 minutes someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone passes away from ALS; and

WHEREAS, on average, patients diagnosed with ALS survive only 2 to 5 years from the time of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, the exact causes of ALS are unknown and there is no known cure for ALS; and

WHEREAS, people who have served in the military are more likely to develop ALS and die from the disease than those with no history of military service; and

WHEREAS, securing access to new therapies, durable medical equipment and communication technologies is of vital importance to people living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, clinical trials play a pivotal role in evaluating new treatments, enhancing quality of life and fostering assistive technologies for those living with ALS; and

WHEREAS, the ALS Association is the largest philanthropic funder of ALS research globally and has committed more than \$154 million to support more than 550 projects across the United States and 18 other countries; and

WHEREAS, the ALS Association is committed to accelerating the pace of discovery, fueled by the hope that one day ALS will be a livable disease for everyone, everywhere, until a cure can be found; and

WHEREAS, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Awareness Month provides an opportunity to increase public awareness of the dire circumstances of people living with ALS, acknowledge the terrible impact this disease has on those individuals and their families and support research to eradicate this disease; now, therefore, be it

Senator **TALBOT ROSS:** Thank you, Madam President. I just wanted to acknowledge a couple of key points with this bill.

LD 530 simply removes the current statutory presumption that anyone convicted as an adult, punishable by a year or more of incarceration, lacks the moral character to become a Maine attorney. The law does not remove the Maine Board of Bar Examiners or the Maine Supreme Court's ability and the process for evaluating a bar applicant's character and granting or denying a license. So, it does not remove the ability to grant or deny a license, it simply removes the presumption of being unfit.

The burden of demonstrating good character remains on the applicant and the Board will consider the nature of the offense, how long since the offense, evidence of rehabilitation, and any extraordinary circumstances. The current presumption, however, has a chilling effect on people with past records who may otherwise be interested in exploring becoming an attorney.

Maine has a dire shortage of attorneys, having to release and dismiss charges now because not enough defense attorneys. This bill aligns with the American Bar Association guidance and other states including the state of Washington. The ABA

guidance actually goes much further than this bill in limiting the consideration of past records. This bill promotes successful reentry through employment and upward economic mobility. It promotes racial and economic equity because BIPOC people, people of color, and lower income people are disparately impacted by the criminal justice system. So, I'll just repeat again, this bill does not remove the process for evaluating a bar applicant's character, granting or denying a license, this bill simply removes the presumption of being unfit for people who have paid their debt to society and only want to move on with their lives.

Thank you, Madam President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair now recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Cyrway.

Senator **CYRWAY:** Thank you, Madam President. I'd just like to say that, you know, being in law enforcement and working with attorneys and whatever, I've always kept a high thought that that position was up with law enforcement, and we in law enforcement are held to a high standard and this would diminish the position, as far as I'm concerned, and I think that this would harm the -- I guess the character of the position.

So, I just wanted to say that, and I think that I would not vote for this bill. Thank you, Madam President.

Senator **BRADSTREET:** Thank you, Madam President. I'll briefly state the reason I'm voting against this motion.

This bill would make Maine even an extreme outlier compared to other states. There are only six states right now that have a threshold higher than what the federal government is. You know, a little bit of a difference is fine, but when it's about 29 or 30% higher than the federal threshold, that's a problem. And I think it will discourage people from investing in Maine, hiring Maine people, and growing Maine jobs.

Thank you, Madam President.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Tipping.

Senator **TIPPING:** Thank you, Madam President. I thought we had agreed not to speak on things, but I'll be quick.

I'll just say this is an important protection for Maine workers. It has become increasingly important as we've seen the misclassification of employees to deny them overtime benefits. We saw, for instance, in testimony before our committee, a construction worker who said he was labeled as a salaried foreperson and denied the money that was owed to him. There's also a letter to the Department of Labor that really struck my heart. It was from Paige Murdock, a manager at Dollar General in Eliot, who noted that because her overtime hours are free for the company, they make us work 60 to 70 hours a week. I was working so much, I couldn't make it to my church. My family was always asking why aren't you at home, mom? And most of my hours weren't even spent managing the store, but instead

stocking shelves or running the cash register since we never had enough staff.

The overtime threshold was last set in the '70s. It at that point protected 66% of salaried employees. It's never been updated. It currently protects just 12% in Maine. This would bring it up to 23%. It's not a huge increase, but it would help a lot of people, putting it in line with the federal threshold that was put into law last year. Unfortunately, that's been paused by a judge, but even the Trump Administration has appealed that.

So, this is the least we can do to protect these workers, and I hope the Senate agrees. Thank you.

So, thanks.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair would recognize the Senator from Oxford, Senator Bennett.

Senator **BENNETT:** Madam President, I just wish to make a parliamentary point, which is that notwithstanding whether a matter is -- requires a two-thirds vote or not, or whether it's recorded or not, a Member in their seat is required to vote, and so, I just point that out. So, there was an error committed in that - in this particular case. I think there were several Members that maybe not have voted. Thank you.

On motion by Senator **BENNETT** of Oxford, the Senate **RECONSIDERED** whereby this Bill was **PASSED TO BE ENACTED**.

On further motion by the same Senator, supported by a Division of one-fifth of the members present and voting, a Roll Call was ordered.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair now recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Bennett.

Senator **BENNETT:** Thank you, Madam President. I'm actually very happy that this bill got more attention than it would have otherwise because it's a bill that I had a privilege of sponsoring and had a unanimous report out of the Agriculture, Conservation, and Forestry Committee, as did a similar bill last session which had an open jacket and I believe every Member of the Senate last year was a co-sponsor of this measure.

Outdoor education is critically important in the state that we live in, and this measure is written in a fashion that it's not requiring a fiscal note at the present time, but it creates the

apparatus for outdoor education to be pursued when funding becomes available. There's a lot of private philanthropic money that is waiting to be invested in this important education and so I'm very happy to see all of the support that this bill is getting and people in this Chamber clamoring to vote in favor of it.
