The following Joint Resolution:

H.P. 1440

JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO BANKING AND INSURANCE SERVICES TO LEGAL CANNABIS AND CANNABIS-RELATED BUSINESSES

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the Second Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the members of the Congress of the United States as follows:

WHEREAS, despite being illegal at the federal level, cannabis is now legal in 33 states, the District of Columbia, Guam and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, which account for 68% of the population of the United States; and

WHEREAS, due to the conflict between state and federal law, the vast majority of financial institutions and insurers are unwilling to provide services to legal cannabis businesses, and those that do could be subject to severe criminal and civil penalties; and

WHEREAS, in addition to legal cannabis businesses being denied access to banking services, businesses that serve the cannabis industry, either directly or indirectly, may be denied banking services simply because they are being paid with money derived from cannabis sales; and

WHEREAS, lacking banking services, many legal cannabis businesses operate solely in cash, and cash-based systems are inefficient, expensive and opaque and make illicit activity more difficult for law enforcement agencies and state regulators to track; and

WHEREAS, lacking access to insurance, many legal cannabis businesses are unable to obtain sufficient coverage for business risks, leaving consumers, employees, vendors and owners without adequate financial protection; and

WHEREAS, a bipartisan group of 38 attorneys general has identified cash associated with the cannabis industry as a public safety concern; and

WHEREAS, despite guidance from the United States
Department of the Treasury, Financial Crimes Enforcement
Network to clarify federal Bank Secrecy Act expectations, federal
banking regulators lack the legal authority to provide banks a safe
harbor from federal law; and

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has the sole authority to solve the banking and insurance issue by enacting legislation that provides protections for insurers, including surety bond writers, and financial institutions that offer services to legal cannabis businesses and service providers for such businesses; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, respectfully urge and request that the Congress of the United States enact federal laws regarding the use and sale of cannabis that respect state law and promote public safety without compromising federal enforcement of money laundering laws against criminal enterprises; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United

States House of Representatives and each Member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Cyrway.

Senator CYRWAY: Thank you, Mr. President, Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, to begin on this subject, I oppose this Joint Resolution as I care about the safety of each and every person and family environment in Maine, especially our kids and their future. This fell short in the last session when the rules of marijuana were legalized and very little law enforcement involvement. This was left up to the code enforcement officer, who does not do any criminal law, to deal with, to opt in towns. The money does not go to municipalities. It goes to the State. So we put the cart before the horse, the law enforcement. Juveniles look at recreational use as fun and now we are trying to open the door for funding to explore the market. Explore the market. Federal laws supersede state and we are to uphold the state and federal laws as we are sworn to. I had one Senator speak on the Senate Floor two sessions ago several times that the banks would overlook this problem and I told them that they would not. Who was right? We took a Schedule 1 drug, equal to cocaine, a legal substance, to recreationally use by our state and now we want to change an FDA and federal law for banking and insurance use. This is wrong. We have created an illegal monster and think we can feed it to calm it down. It'll get hungry again, believe me. It will ruin the state's future and our youth's. I constantly hear complaints of odor and also lowering the value of property owners. This is supporting the few that get into the business and hurting the rest of the people that own property. The property owners of Maine have very little say. I have seen children in different schools and I listen to resource officers, teachers, and many others that are experiencing three to four times the amount of use of marijuana in their school systems since this has been legalized. What are we doing to our children? We are going to go and legalize it now, or try to push the federal government to say it's okay, and we're worried about an opioid crisis which is killing people and we go and put marijuana first. I'm saddened to hear what's been going on here in the state of Maine and I care about our kids and I've been fighting this for years and I'm still not going to give up. I'm not giving up on our children. So I'm voting no on this today and I hope you follow my light. Thank you, Mr. President.
