Senator THIBODEAU: Thank you, Mr. Chair. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, it's moments like these that we're reminded how special our State is. You know, each and every one of us comes from a community that we're very, very proud of and we know that when tragedy strikes our community rallies because we are filled with a State of caring people. We've very blessed. Very blessed. That doesn't happen in every state in the nation, but it happens here. Today we're here to remember a young man from Waldo County, Riley. Many of his friends and his family are here with us in the Chamber. They've come to remember a young man that meant so much to them. I want to tell you just a little bit about the community that I'm from, the folks in Waldo County. Every one of us has had tragedy strike in our communities and seen our communities rally. Well it's no different back home in Waldo County. When there's a lot of broken hearts and a lot of tears have been shed, the community rallied and has held many fundraisers in Riley's memory because they are setting up a memorial scholarship fund. You see, Riley was a terrific young electrician. He got that from his Dad. He grew up doing that kind of work right by the side of his Dad. Riley's Dad invested in his son and he is very proud of the fact that during the competitions over at the Augusta Civic Center just recently that he finished first place in the electrical competition. Very proud of that. This scholarship is going to be given out to folks that are going on to train in the - at our vocational technical schools, learning a trade. I'll assure you that Waldo County isn't known for its wealth. They've raised \$34,000 in this young man's memory. I think that speaks volumes both about our community as well as what they thought of Riley. Today is February 22, Riley's baseball uniform number. If you ever have the pleasure of going and watching baseball and seeing the Mount View Mustangs play, you'll never again see a young man with that number. It's every parent's worst nightmare and there's only one thing that we can do for one another in cases like this and that's to convey to our friends, to our neighbors, and the people that are grieving that we care. So that's what we're here today to do, is to convey to Riley's entire family and to the community that I have the good fortune of representing in the State Senate that we care. We're going to miss Riley but we will never forget him. Thank you, Mr. President.

Senator KATZ: These are three honorees of the Kennebec Valley Chamber of Commerce recently that are from my district that I know well and that I, with everyone's indulgence, would just like to brag about for a few moments. First of all, Cathy DeMerchant, who is the President of Capital Area Staffing Solutions, her business was recognized as one of the businesses of the year by the Chamber. Cathy may be known to some of vou. She's the President of the Sportsman's Alliance of Maine.
