**JOINT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING

He worked at Lederle Labs in Pearl River, New York before moving to Presque Isle in 1962 to work for Vahlsing's Maine Sugar Industries, later taking leadership roles in Potato Service, Colby Starch and Northland Frozen Foods. Involved in the Maine manufacturing and agricultural industries, as well as Maine Democratic politics, he was an associate of Maine Governors, United States Senators and members of the United States Congress. He was a very active member of St. Mary Catholic Church in Presque Isle, serving as Parish Council Chairman and leading the church rosary group, and later became involved with the Holy Spirit Parish of Lock Haven, Pennsylvania. In Presque Isle, he led an anti-war peace group and served as a board member of Presque Isle's public library. In retirement, he consulted for the World Bank as a volunteer, supporting many developing countries with agricultural and food processing opportunities throughout the world.
