WHEREAS, the Legislature has learned with deep regret of the death of:

(4-5) Thomas Farrell, of Kennebunk. Dr. Farrell spent over 50 years in education: first as a high school teacher and coach in Maine, and then as an administrator and superintendent of schools in Maine, Colorado and Taiwan. A national leader in drug prevention education, he consulted for many years with a number of federal agencies and Major League Baseball International. He served on the Board of Directors of the National Federation of Parents for Drug Free Youth from 1985 to 1989. In 2001, he was awarded the Enrique S. Camarena Award for his contributions to America's drug abuse reduction effort. He also received the Carey E. McDonald National Citation from the National High School Athletic Coaches Association in 2000. He taught and coached sports at various high schools in Maine for 10 years before moving into administration. He served as Assistant Principal at Mt. Blue High School before becoming Principal at Dirigo High School and then Principal of Skowhegan Area High School, which he led to become one of Maine's top three schools and which was named a National School of Excellence in 1987. In 1988, he moved to Aspen, Colorado, where he was Principal of Aspen High School for 2 years and Superintendent of Aspen School District for 13 years. Returning to Maine, he served as the Superintendent of the Kennebunk School District from 2003 to 2008. From 2008 to 2017, he lived in Taiwan, where he was Director of the Kaohsiung American School. He revitalized the school by quadrupling its enrollment, improving its staff and overseeing the construction of a new state-of-the-art campus. The school's new athletic complex was named after him in 2016. Dr. Farrell will be long remembered and sadly missed by his wife of 46 years, Debbie, his family and friends and all those whose lives he touched;
